

World Social Science Seminar

- IRDR-ICoE Taipei co-sponsored and organized a WSS seminar on Decision-making under conditions of uncertainty, 7-15 Dec 2013 in NZ
- Other co-sponsors included ISSC, IRDR RIA Project, START, and Royal Society of New Zealand.
- Participants: 25 Fellows from 18 countries were selected from 109 applications from around the world

 Participants explored if and how the RIA conceptual framework for response to natural hazards can be integrated across disciplines and

cultural contexts







Research Seed Grants to WSS Fellows

- ➤ ICoE Taipei funded four follow-on research seed grants (\$15,000 USD each) to Fellows of the 2013 WSS Seminar.
- Six proposals were received and reviewed by David Johnston, Dick Eiser, ICoE Taipei, ISSC, and START staff
- ICoE Taipei approved four proposals on 26 March 2014
- All projects are underway and to be completed by December 2014
- ➤ ISSC also supported several Fellows to attend the IRDR Conference in Beijing in June 2014





Advanced Institute Forensic Investigation of Disasters (FORIN)

 The first FORIN was held at the ICoE, Taipei in March 2012







Advanced Institute Forensic Investigation of Disasters (FORIN II)

- FORIN II will be held during 21-25 October, 2014, at Academia Sinica in Taipei
- FORIN II will provide 15-20 young to mid-career researchers and practitioners from Southeast Asia with enhanced skills to carry out FORIN related studies
- FORIN II will include educational modules, handson interactive exercises, and field visits





Advanced Institute

Psychological Intervention after Disasters (PIAD)

- ➤ PIAD Als are planned to be held in Kunming, Taipei, Kuala Lumpur, and Yokohama, from 2014 to 2016.
- ➤ The first AI will be held on December 1-4, 2014 in Kunming, China
- These Als are co-sponsored by ICoE Taipei, IUPsyS, the Chinese Academy of Science, and ICSU-ROAP.
- Participants and Faculty
 - > Young investigators and practitioners (with a PhD or equivalent)
 - ➤ Participants will primarily come from the Asia-Pacific region
 - > Recruitment of faculty and potential participants is underway
 - ➤ One faculty member from Taiwan will share her experience in psychological intervention after Chi-Chi earthquake and Morakot typhoon in Taiwan





Advanced Institute Disaster Risk and Loss Reduction

- This Advanced Institute will provide the participants with practical knowledge on disaster risk and loss reduction.
- Major topics/case studies to be covered include flood risk reduction, earthquake risk reduction, early warning technology, vulnerability assessment, disaster preparedness, insurance and other financial mechanisms, recovery and reconstruction after disasters.
- The background material and AI announcement are being prepared and faculty members are being recruited.
- This Advanced Institute will be offered in the Spring 2015.





WSS Seminar on Sustainable Urbanization

- The seminar, co-sponsored and organized by ISSC, ICoE Taipei, and National Taipei University, will be held 2-9 Nov 2014 in Taipei.
- This seminar offers the opportunity for 20 early career social scientists from across the globe to interact with the leading thinkers in the area of sustainable urbanization as well as policy-makers, practitioners, activists and other stakeholders.
- The Call for Applications has been issued and the deadline for submission of applications is 16 June 2014.



Pan-Asia Risk Reduction (PARR) Fellowship Program

- The PARR offers unique research, training, and educational opportunities to Asian scientists, practitioners, and policy-makers to enhance their capabilities for advancing and applying knowledge on critical issues of vulnerability and risk in the Asia-Pacific regions.
- PARR Core Partners: START, Oscar M. Lopez Center (Manila), Kyoto University, ICoE Taipei, Manila Observatory (Philippines), Asia-Pacific Network for Global Change Research (APN), and Thammasat University (Thailand).
- Fellows receive grants to visit Host Institute (e.g., NCDR, Taiwan)
 where they collaborate with mentors
- The Inception meeting will be held 24-25 July in Manila, Philippines
- The Pilot Program is scheduled from July December 2014 with the initial focus on urban disaster risk and vulnerability under global environmental change.





Disaster Risk Assessment Meeting

- In November 2013, the ICSU Executive Board approved the creation of a Group of Experts on Disaster Risk Assessment that would provide expert assessments on disaster risk reduction science.
- The first group meeting was held in Paris on 2 May 2014
- ICoE Taipei will host the second group meeting from 16 to18 October at the Academia Sinica in Taipei.
- Membership of the ad-hoc group includes ICSU Executive Board and Secretariat, IRDR (Salvano Briceno, Susan Cutter, David Johnston, and Kuni Takeuchi), GEOUNIONS, and ICSU Regional Programs on Hazards





Visiting Scientists program

- Prof. Slobodan Simonovic of University of Western Ontario, Canada, was the 2014 ICoE visiting scientist (April 1-April 30, 2014)
- He visited four major Universities/institutes, in Taiwan. The focus of the discussions was on impact of changing climate on natural disasters management
- Presented five lectures related to climate change impact research, water resources management, system approach for managing natural disasters in a changing climate, etc
- ➤ Plan to work with Prof. Simonovic for future collaboration and training workshops on system approach for managing disasters in 2015









Domestic Program

- Continue to promote and coordinate domestic IRDR-related research projects:
 - Mega-seismic risk and multi-geological disasters in Taiwan
 - Impact of Climate and Land Use Change on Environmental Hazards and Adaptation
 - Vulnerability Assessment for Heat Wave and Relevant Adaptation Strategy Recommendations
 - Open ISDM: Open Information Systems for Disaster Management
 - Taiwan Climate Change Projection and Information Platform (TCCIP)



Future Plan

- Continue to cooperate with international and domestic organizations to organize symposia, advanced institutes, training workshops and other disaster-related scientific activities for capacity building
- Continue to support visiting scientists and research fellows program
- Continue to build a partnership network of IRDR-related research in Taiwan and the international scientific community.
- Continue to support IRDR and ICSU Programs (e.g.,Future Earth)
