- New Science Officer:
 - Some 50 applications received (MA to PhD / assoc. prof. level)
 - Contract from 5 May; successful hand-over mid-May to mid-June
- End of contract Junior Science Officer
- Resignation of Communications Officer (1,5 years)
- Resignation of ED (after 1 year)
- 3 interns (monthly contracts) to update contact database
- Employment handbook completed and revised

IRDR Integrated Research on Disaster Risk IPO / RADI Management Issues

- Audit (January to March 2015)
 - Launched at two days's notice (with high and unstructured labour input needed at times of Tokyo and Sendai conferences)
 - No terms of reference provided in English
 - Complete information not shared (CAST, IPO, ICO components; finances)
 - Sessions with auditors without translation
- Examples for ad hoc measures restricting autonomy of IPO
 - New restrictions on expenses (transport, procurement)
 - Gentlemens' Agreement on funding for projects (also abroad) withdrawn
 - Authority to sign withdrawn without notification or explanation
- Retrospective tax claims on non-salary benefits
 - Mistaken information provided by RADI on health insurance benefits during contract negotiations
 - Health insurance retrospectively taxed (2012-1015), detracting up to 80% from monthly salaries, pushing up tax bracket by up to 250%
- Salaries withheld and payments delayed without explanation



Communication Successes

- IRDR contact database increased from 1000 to 5000
- Daily IRDR news items generated mainly from IPO
 - Paris commitment (30 parties > 30 news item pcm) only party honoured
- IRDR website improved but still clunky
- IRDR Publications issued in a timely fashion



Communication Challenges

• Solutions needed for

- Google services blocked (e-mail, maps, fonts, scholar, cloud, etc.)
- Social media blocked (FB, Twitter)
- inefficient work arounds (shared drive / email / attachments)
- use of private laptops, credit card payments and home-wifi-solutions to make up for these office blockades

• Internet is wired at RADI / Wifi unreliable

- No remote access to office files
- WiFi on office mobile devices blocked in-house

• No dedicated IT support for IPO offered by RADI

(ad hoc help is welcome but cannot be controlled or held accountable)
