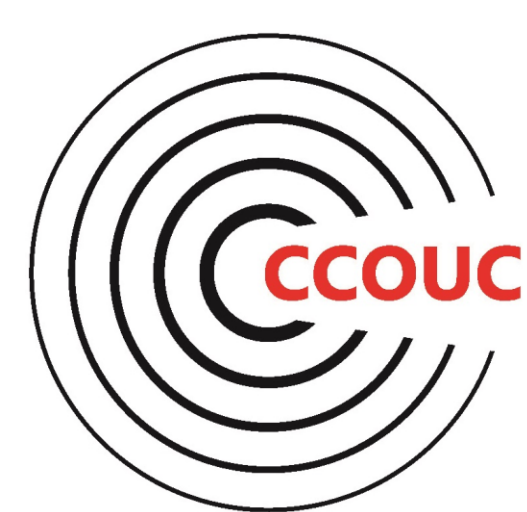

Field-based training plays a vital role in preparing health professional students for the complex realities of disaster risk management and humanitarian medicine. For students from developed regions, gaining firsthand exposure to healthcare systems in resource-deficit communities is essential to nurturing a new generation of public health professionals with a global vision. Beyond a general introduction to field-based and service-learning models, this forum will showcase fresh insights from the CCOUC humanitarian field-based training program in Cambodia (July 2026), highlighting key operational challenges in dengue and flooding risk management. 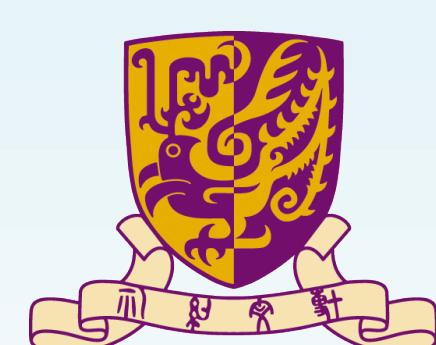
